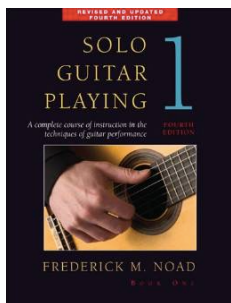


Classical Guitar (\$150 - \$250) - [Link](#)

Choose a guitar that feels good in your hands. You can bargain with the sales person for a guitar bag and a new set of strings as part of the total cost of the guitar. For beginners ask the sales guy to “lower the action” on the guitar. This will make the strings easier to press down and help you stick to playing the classical guitar.



Frederick Noad - Solo Guitar Playing (\$20) - [Link](#)



This will be your study guide to playing and understanding the classical guitar. Fully illustrated with diagrams, photographs, and over 200 musical exercises and repertoire selections, this book offers thorough instruction in every phase of classical guitar playing.



Ergonomic Guitar Leg Rest - [Link](#)



The leg rest helps to bring the guitar into the upright position. This allows the guitarist to achieve the full reach and range of motion across the fret board.



Portable Music Stand (\$15 - \$25) - [Link](#)



Portable is the key here. You will need to transport your stand to and from any place you want to play. However you do want it to be sturdy. Test the music stand by pushing down on the arms and legs. It should only slightly bend.
